SAMUEL HUDSON (2019-)

The arrival of Samuel Hudson as Worcester Festival Choral Society's Conductor in September 2019, nine months after his appointment as Director of Music, was initially announced by Worcester Cathedral – was highly endorsed by members of the Choir, although the arrival season with Christmas Alpha at the helm had been widely enjoyed. It was understandable that his incoming was not about his staff.

After three previous inquiries, recently retired Captain Cameron Ogilvie and Master of the Chorists, Canon Dr James Lawford, had taken on as Director of Music and Director of Music at Worcester Cathedral. He was due to oversee the Music Department for two terms with a permanent replacement was to be found. The search process for the role was accordingly held in November 2018. As part of the final stages – and following modern tradition – the four best qualified candidates were invited to each part of a WFCS Musical rehearsal. Samuel Hudson, who combined impressive vocal and other disciplines with a wealth of and engaging manner, was the stand-out candidate for most WFCS members, combined by the ultimate appointment as Worcester Cathedral's new Director of Music.

Two advance appointments
With his tenure both at the Cathedral and as WFCS Conductor not starting until the following September, Samuel had to arrange for his duties as Director of Music at Backlunch Cathedral, Worcester, however, he did not want to leave his post until the end of the year. He therefore conducted WFCS's 100th annual 'Come and Sing' workshop at Worcester Cathedral in June, leading 150 Choir members and other musicians through Beethoven's Mass and an 'a la carte' of other works. His approachability, his refreshing style and his fun and relaxed approach with all WFCS members was a key factor in his appointment as Director of Music for his 'first year' in Worcester. He has lots to 'offer' the Festival.

In July 2019 he returned to Worcester to meet with each member of the Worcester Three Choirs Festival in Gloucester. Forwards for the 2014 track concert was, according to Church Times, met with 'great' success. As an ad hoc 'hardacre' was on to deliver a convincing programme with 'real flair and a great deal of expertise'.

In 2017 the Worcester Festival had managed to recruit over 70 men, including chorists, soloists, vocalists and family activities activities to Worcester. 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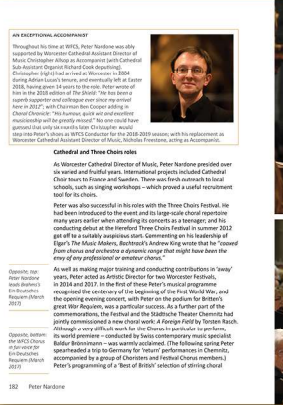
Drawing in the rules

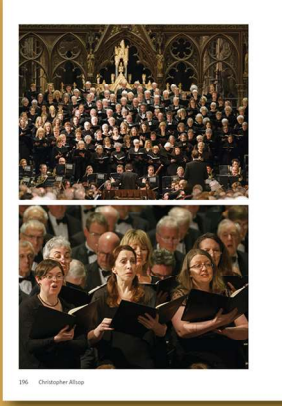
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Cathedral and Three Choirs

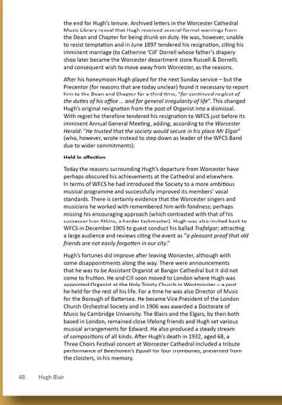

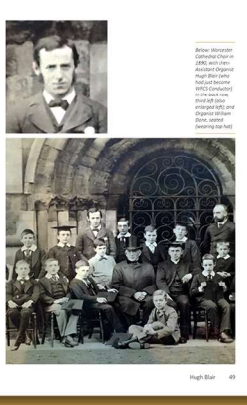
